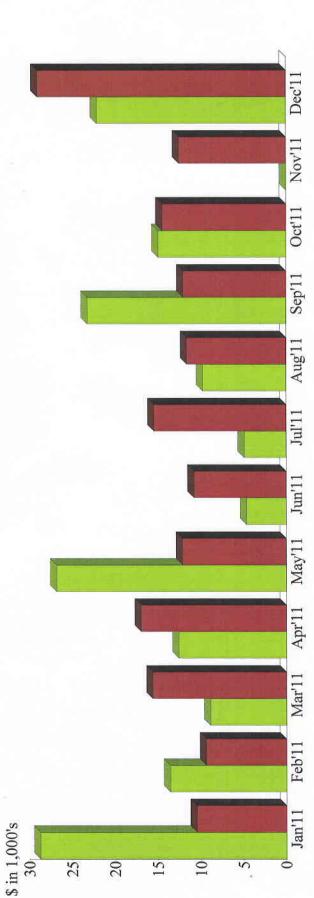

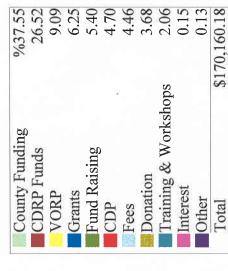

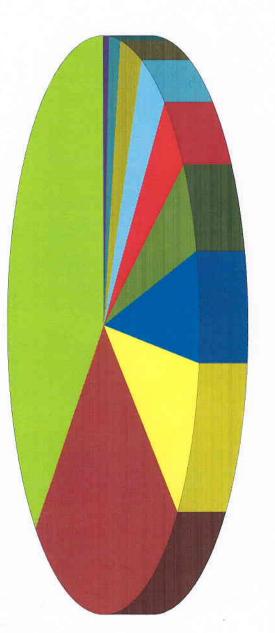

Income and Expense by Month January through December 2011





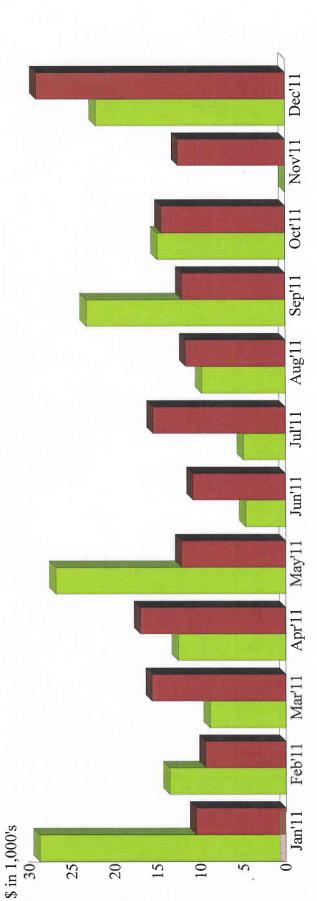


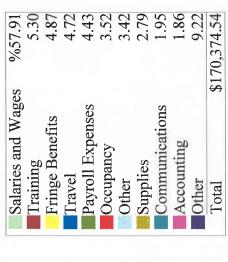

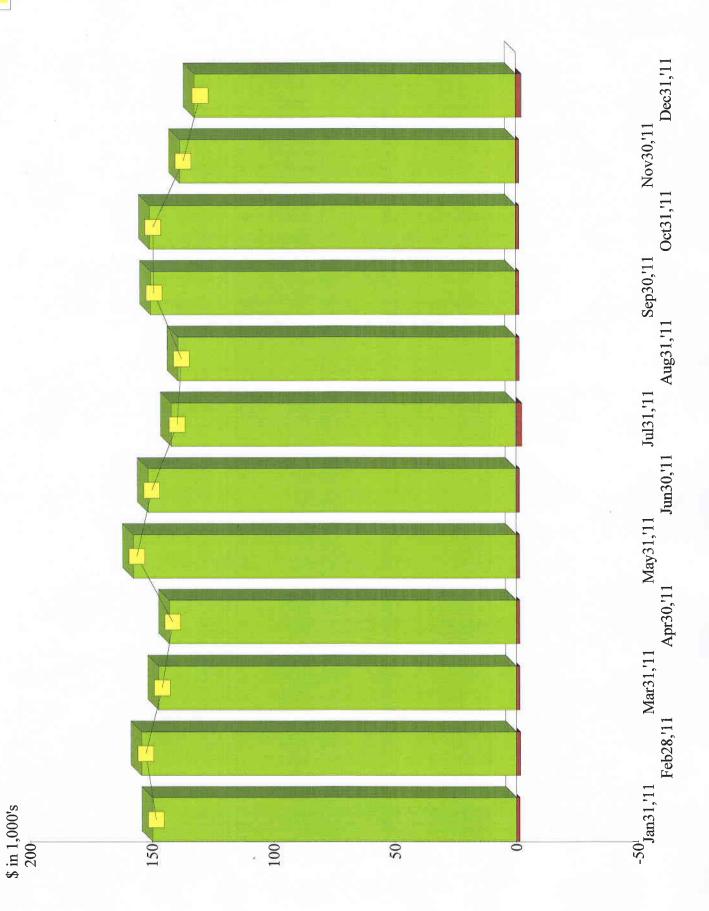






Expense Summary January through December 2011





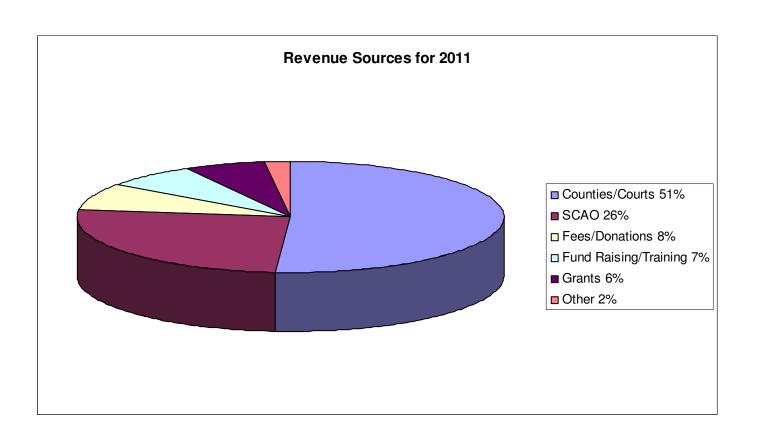

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2011

Personnel

Northern Community Mediation (NCM) has three, full-time employees: two Intake Coordinators and the Executive Director. Bert (Roberta) Rousseau has been with NCM for six years. As an Intake Coordinator, she is responsible for divorce, domestic relations, Special Education, and Access & Visitation (parenting time) cases. She is also responsible for the Victim-Offender, Reconciliation Program. As an Intake Coordinator, Wayne Tri is responsible for general civil and all other cases other than those covered by Bert Rousseau. He also oversees the Child Protection Mediation Program . Wayne has been with NCM since July 2010. Dr. Jane Millar has been the Executive Director of NCM since July 2003.

In addition to the paid staff (who are all trained mediators), NCM has 53 volunteer mediators. The majority of the volunteer mediators have received advanced training in specialized fields of mediation. The table below depicts the areas of expertise along with the number of mediators qualified in those fields.

As can be seen, NCM has a sufficient number of mediators. The challenge facing NCM relates to the availability of the mediators. Many are retired or work full-time. Hence, they are either traveling or only available on a limited basis for daytime mediations. Additionally, more and more of the cases referred to NCM are complex and require specialized training.

NCM benefits from the volunteer efforts of Marge Parish. During college school terms, Marge helps with office work one afternoon a week. Additionally, on the Day of Caring, four members of the Rotary Club of Petoskey Sunrise helped with fall cleaning at NCM. Day of Caring is sponsored by United Way. Volunteers from around the community donate their time to help non-profit organizations.

As a courtesy to the Board of Directors, the Executive Director documented her time out of the office throughout 2011. The details of this report are available for the Board's review upon request.

NCM remains to be in compliance with the State Court Administrative Office (SCAO) policy for background checks. All employees, interns, volunteer mediators and other volunteers must undergo a background check through the Michigan State Police

(ICHAT), as well as a criminal registry check through the Department of Human Services every two years.

<u>Trainings and Workshops</u>

Two training/workshop opportunities were offered by NCM:

In April, Wanda Joseph and Bill Waters facilitated the 2.411, SCAO approved forty-hour training. It was held at the Charlevoix Public Library. There were 11 participants. Two were attorneys and one was a judge. As of December 31, 2011, seven of the 11 had completed their 10-hour internship and are now mediating for NCM.

In October, Steve Tresidder conducted an eight-hour, advanced training. The session was based upon the book *Making Money Talk* by J. Anderson Little, the focus of which related to mediating issues relating to money, such as debt and foreclosures.

NCM staff participated in professional development opportunities offered at sites other than at NCM. Through the Michigan Alliance for Families, Bert Rousseau attended an anti-bullying training in Sault Ste. Marie. She also attended the Michigan Association of Court Mediators Conference, where she presented a session on domestic violence, intake screening. Wayne Tri also attended the Michigan Association of Court Mediators Conference.

Jane Millar attended a Succession Planning Seminar offered by the Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation and the Charlevoix County Community Foundation. She also participated in a Citizen Dispute Resolution Program school program workshop, as well as a QR code workshop.

Meetings & Gatherings

In addition to regular meetings relating to the operations of NCM, the staff participates in a variety of specific meetings.

On January 13, 2011, NCM conducted its annual meeting for 2010. It was held from 12:05 pm to 12:35 pm at City Park Grill in Charlevoix, Michigan. Minutes of the 2011 annual meeting will be available on the NCM website (www.northernmediation.org) upon approval of the Board of Directors at the 2012 Annual Meeting, which is scheduled for Thursday, January 19, 2012.

The Board of Directors met six times in 2010: January, March, May, July, September and November. The minutes of the Board of Directors meetings are available on the NCM website. In the months that the Board of Directors did not meet, the Executive Committee met.

Approximately 40 people attended the Appreciation Luncheon, which was held on May 16 at the City Park Grill in Petoskey. The following individuals were recognized: Jeff Higgs for Veteran Mediator of the Year, Marge Parish for Advocate of the Year, and Kendal Taylor for Rookie Mediator of the Year. Emily Meyerson, who was the keynote speaker, talked about her experience as a Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar at the university in Bangkok, Thailand.

Presentations and Promotion

The year 2011 was a busy one in terms of participation in community events. NCM participated in Project Connect, a day of free services for those in need provided by various non-profit organizations in the community. The Executive Director served as a mentor for Leadership Little Traverse, a program sponsored by the Petoskey Chamber of Commerce, as well as a mentor for Leadership Charlevoix County, a program sponsored by the Charlevoix Chamber of Commerce. She was a judge for the Shay Elementary School spelling bee in Harbor Springs, Michigan.

Caseload

The number of cases opened in 2011 is almost identical to the number of cases opened in 2010: 435 vs. 441. The number of cases closed in 2011 is slightly lower than the number of cases closed in 2010: 446 vs. 455. The pie chart titled Dispute Types graphically shows the breakdown of the various types of cases handled by NCM. Breach of Contract is the most prevalent type of cases (29.37%). This is followed by cases involving divorce and domestics matters (23.54%). The third most common types of cases relate to the Parenting Time cases (13.68%), followed by the Victim Offender Reconciliation Program (12.78%). The other significant number of cases relates to Child Protection Mediation (9.64%).

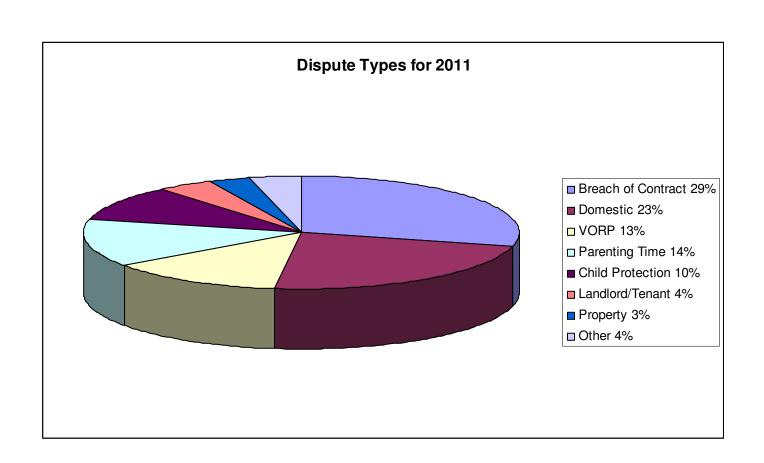

Agreement Rates

It is interesting to note that agreement rates relating to mediations done through the CDRP are down throughout the state of Michigan. The reason for this circumstance appears to be twofold. First, the centers are receiving more complex cases, which historically result in lower agreement rates. Second, the poor economy creates situations that make it very difficult for the involved to be able to afford an agreeable solution.

The agreement rate percentages for 2011 are depicted in the pie chart entitled Agreement Rates. The table below shows the comparison of agreement rates between 2010 and 2011.

Referral Sources

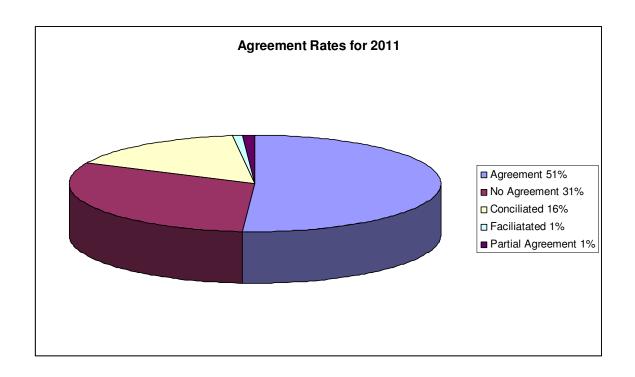

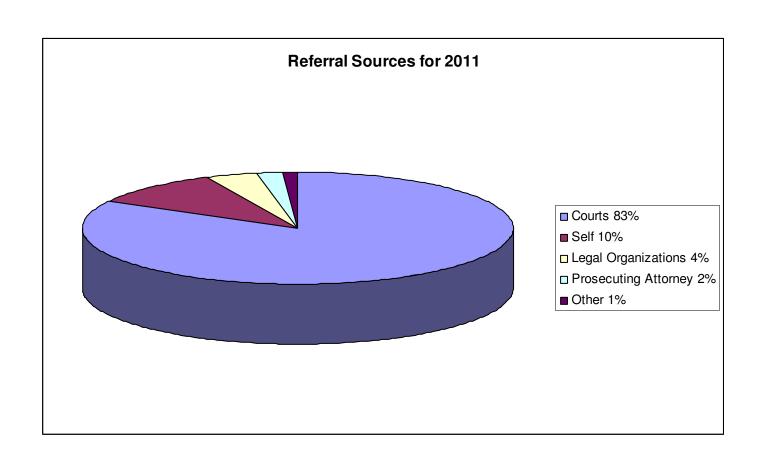

Fund Raising and Grants

The seventh annual Theatre Party was held on Monday, March 14, 2011. NCM budgeted \$8,000.00 in revenue and \$2,445.00 in expenses for a profit of \$5,555.00. In reality, \$9,134.71 was collected in revenue, and expenses totaled \$2,270.62 for a profit of \$6,864.71, which was \$1,309.71 over budget.

Although NCM does not charge for mediation services that are ordered by the courts, it does charge a minimal administrative fee for those cases that are not referred by the courts. In 2011, \$4,095.00 was collected in fees. Of the 96 individuals who were charged a fee, 22 did not pay, which represents 22.9%. The number of individuals charged a fee in 2011 is 26 fewer than in 2010 because more fees were waived in 2011. An additional \$200.00 was collected for Special Education mediation services plus \$3,300.00 for Access & Visitation cases.

Donations for 2011 totaled \$3,210.50, as compared to \$2,620.00 in 2010. The Donor Campaign brought in an additional \$3,050.00.00, as compared to \$1,875.00 in 2010.

NCM received the following grant awards in 2011:

- The Petoskey Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation
 - \$3,200 to help defray costs of 40-hour training
- Bay Harbor Foundation
 - \$3,663 to help defray costs of Parenting Time Program
- United Way
 - \$3,573.75 to help defray costs of Victim Offender Reconciliation Program
- Charlevoix Lions Club
 - \$200.00 to help defray costs of a new printer

Board Retreat

On February 28, 2011, the Board of Directors met at the Weathervane Restaurant in Charlevoix for a board retreat. Steve Tresidder facilitated the retreat by facilitating a SWOT analysis. Based upon the identification of the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats facing NCM, the Board developed four primary goals: increase public awareness, increase reliability of funding, maintain good relations with courts, and develop a succession plan. All four of these goals is being actively pursued. In fact, the succession plan has been completed and is to be reviewed on an annual basis during the month of January.

In Kind Contributions

To a non-profit organization, in-kind contributions are significant for two primary reasons. First, when writing grant applications, in kind donations are considered a means of determining community support of the organization. Second, in kind donations help to defray expenses. The top five areas of contributions in 2011 related to the following:

The total amount of in kind contributions for 2011 was \$200,792.66, which is slightly lower than the in kind contributions in 2010. The in kind donations constitute 55.1% of the total budget. The total in kind contributions attributable to the mediators themselves represented 84.7% of the in kind contributions.

Financial Analysis

Although NCM entered the year 2011 with concerns relating to the financial picture, it ended the year with a cash-flow gain of \$2,045.64. In that there was an excess of income over expense for 2011, three major purchases were made in 2011 rather than leaving them for the 2012 fiscal year: a new laptop, copy paper for 2012, and NCM note pads. These three items totaled \$1,709.80. If those expenses had not been expended in 2010, the cash-flow gain for 2011 would have been \$3,755.44. This would have resulted in the balance sheet previous year comparison showing a slight increase from 2010 to 2011 rather than a slight decrease.

Summary

The year 2011 was a good one for NCM. The organization continues to maintain a positive relationship with the courts, as well as with SCAO. It also continues to have a positive reputation within the communities it serves, as well as around the state of Michigan. It is anticipated that the year 2012 will be similar to that of 2011.
