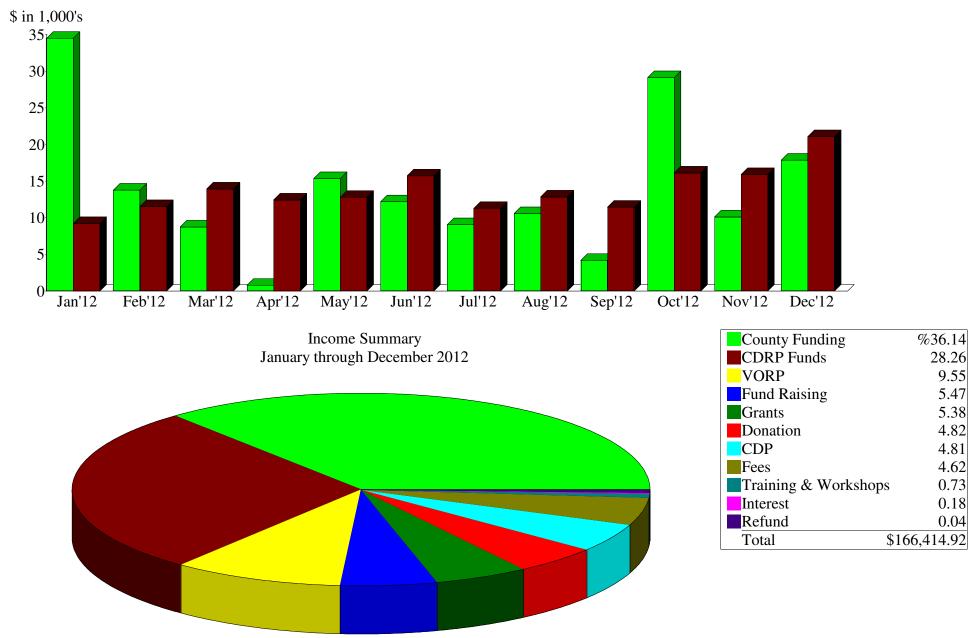

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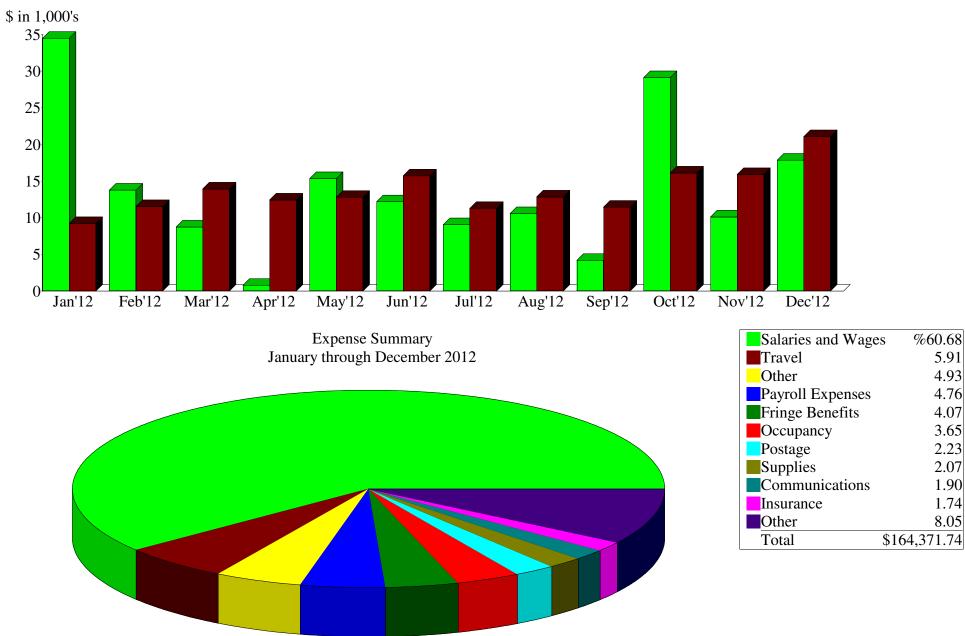
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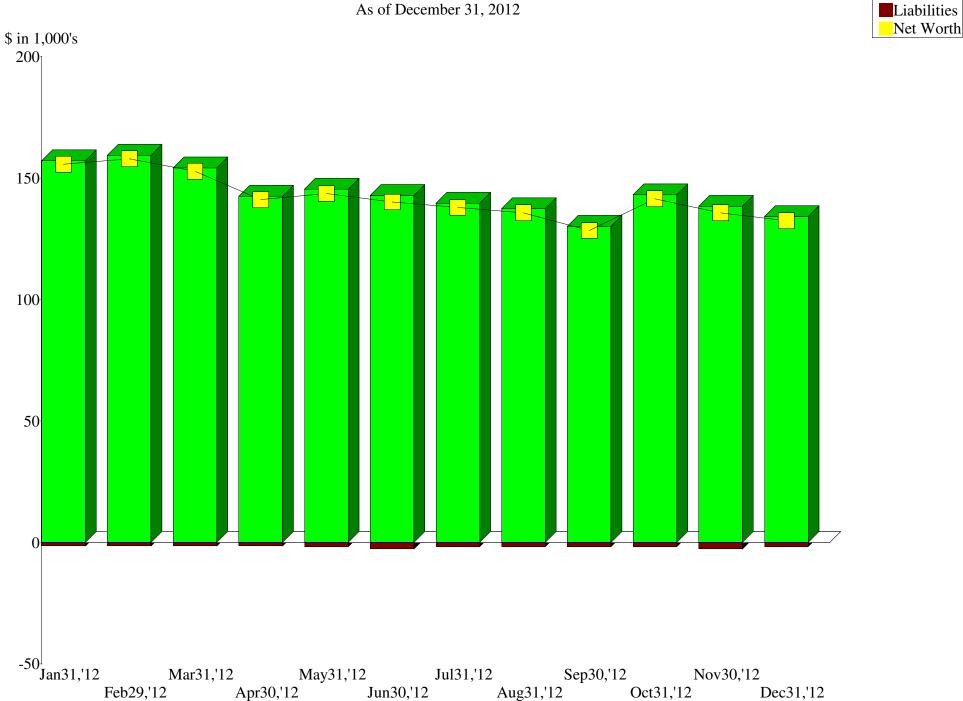
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Net Worth by Month As of December 31, 2012 Assets



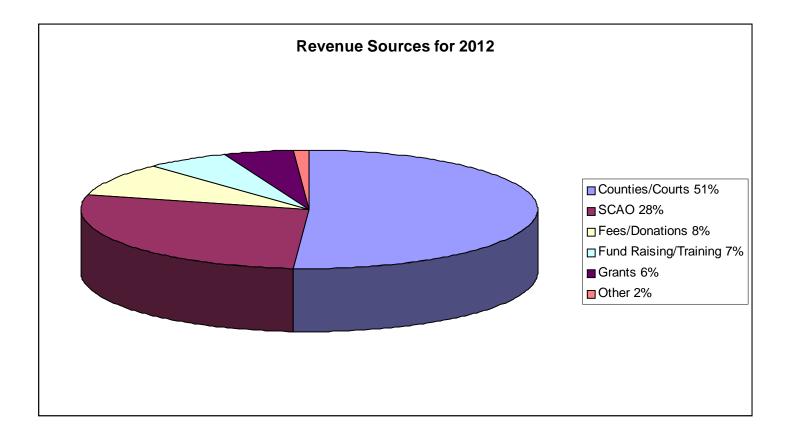

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2012

Personnel

Northern Community Mediation (NCM) has three, full-time employees: the Intake Coordinator, the Assistant Director and the Executive Director. Intake Coordinator Terri Sevener has been with NCM for eight months. She is responsible for general civil, divorce, domestic relations and small claims cases. Assistant Director Bert (Roberta) Rousseau has been with NCM for seven years. She is responsible the victim-Offender Reconciliation Program (VORP), Special Education, Access & Visitation (parenting-time cases), Child Protection Mediation, and Guardianship cases. Dr. Jane Millar has been the Executive Director of NCM since July 2003.

In addition to the paid staff, NCM has 54 volunteer mediators. The majority of the volunteer mediators have received advanced training in specialized fields of mediation. The table below depicts the areas of expertise along with the number of mediators qualified in those fields.

As can be seen, NCM has a sufficient number of mediators. The challenge facing NCM relates to the availability of the mediators. Many are retired or work full-time. Hence, they are either traveling or only available on a limited basis for daytime mediations. Additionally, more and more of the cases referred to NCM are complex and require specialized training.

NCM enforces the State Court Administrative Office (SCAO) requirement that mediators complete a minimum of eight hours of continuing education every two years. NCM also continues to be in compliance with the State Court Administrative Office (SCAO) policy for background checks. All employees, interns, volunteer mediators and other volunteers must undergo a background check through the Michigan State Police (ICHAT), as well as a criminal registry check through the Department of Human Services every two years.

Trainings and Workshops

NCM offered an eight-hour, advanced mediator training in the fall of 2011. Attorney and mediator Steve Tresidder facilitated the workshop entitled *Mediating Monetary Claims & Damages*. There were thirteen participants. Eleven were mediators for NCM, and six were attorneys, four of whom mediate for NCM. All three staff members also participated in the training.

NCM staff participated in professional development opportunities offered at sites other than at NCM. Terri Sevener attended the Michigan Association of Court Mediators (MACM) annual conference, as well as the Intake Roundtable training in Lansing. Bert Rousseau participated in trainings on the ABCs of Bullying Prevention, two Special Education updates, Olweus Bullying Prevention, adult guardianship, as well as attended the MACM annual conference and the Intake Roundtable in Lansing.

Jane Millar attended two School Attendance Mediation training opportunities and the Olweus Bullying Prevention workshop.

Meetings & Gatherings

In addition to regular meetings relating to the operations of NCM, the staff participates in a variety of specific meetings.

On January 19, 2012, NCM conducted its annual meeting for 2011. It was held from 12:05 pm to 12:35 pm at the Bob-In Again in Petoskey, Michigan. Minutes of the 2012 annual meeting will be available on the NCM website (<u>www.northernmediation.org</u>) upon approval of the Board of Directors at the 2013 Annual Meeting, which is scheduled for Thursday, January 17, 2013.

The Board of Directors met six times in 2011: January, March, May, July, October and November. The minutes of the Board of Directors meetings are available on the NCM website. In the months that the Board of Directors did not meet, the Executive Committee met.

On December 11 from 4:30 pm to 6:00 pm, NCM held its annual holiday party. Approximately 35 people enjoyed food, beverage, conversation and friendship.

Approximately 40 people attended the Appreciation Luncheon, which was held on Monday, May 21 at the City Park Grill in Petoskey. The following individuals were recognized: Kendal Taylor for Veteran Mediator of the Year, Tom Schraw for Advocate of the Year, and Lisa Hicklen for Rookie Mediator of the Year. The Honorable Richard May spoke about his retirement plans, specifically focusing upon his humanitarian efforts in Haiti. Caseload

The number of cases opened in 2012 as compared with 2011 was down by 55 cases: 391 vs. 446. This drop in caseload reflects the decrease in case filings, which is beyond the control of NCM. The pie chart titled Dispute Types graphically shows the breakdown of the various types of cases handled by NCM. Breach of Contract is the most prevalent type of case (32%). This is followed by cases involving divorce and domestics matters (24%). The third most common type of case relates to the Victim-Offender Reconciliation

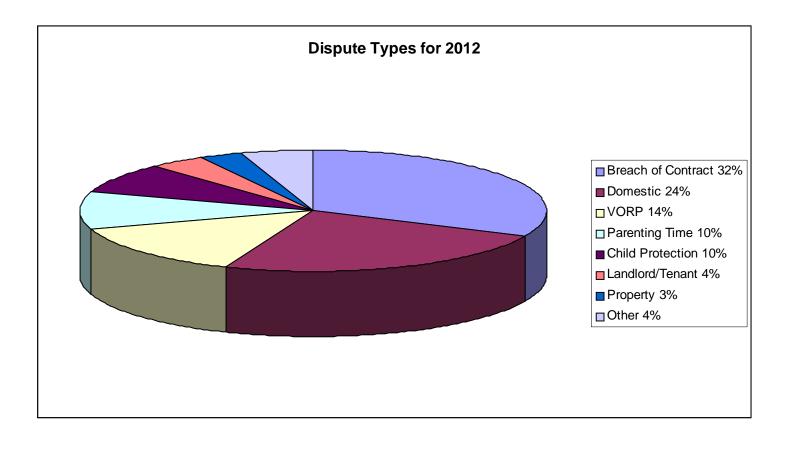

Agreement Rates

It is interesting to note that even though NCM has been receiving more complex cases, the no-agreement rates are down by 4% from 2011 (31% to 27%). This means that more cases are reaching an agreement or a partial agreement, or they are being conciliated. Although there is no percentage shown under facilitated / arbitrated, there was one case that was facilitated in 2012.

The agreement rate percentages for 2012 are depicted in the pie chart entitled Agreement Rates. The table below shows the comparison of agreement rates between 2011 and 2012.

Referral Sources

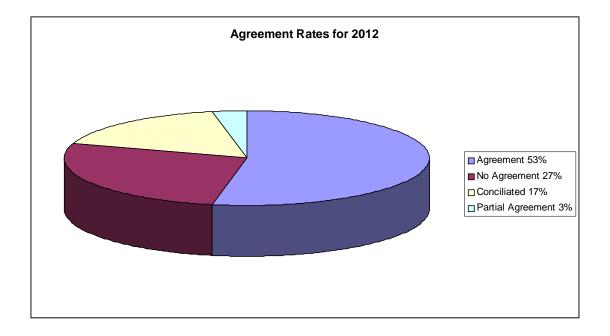
The pattern continues that the vast majority of cases are referred / ordered by the Court (70%). This percentage, however, is significantly lower than the percentage ordered by the courts in 2011 (83%). This decrease in the percentage of court referrals is directly attributable to the fact that court filings in general are down in 2012 from those in 2011. At the same time, self referrals increased from 10% in 2011 to 19% in 2012, which is indicative of the fact that many of the more basic cases are not going to court at all but are coming directly to mediation in order to avoid court filing fees. For similar reasons, referrals by legal organizations and the prosecuting attorneys has also increased from 2011. These percentages are depicted in the pie chart titled Referral Sources.

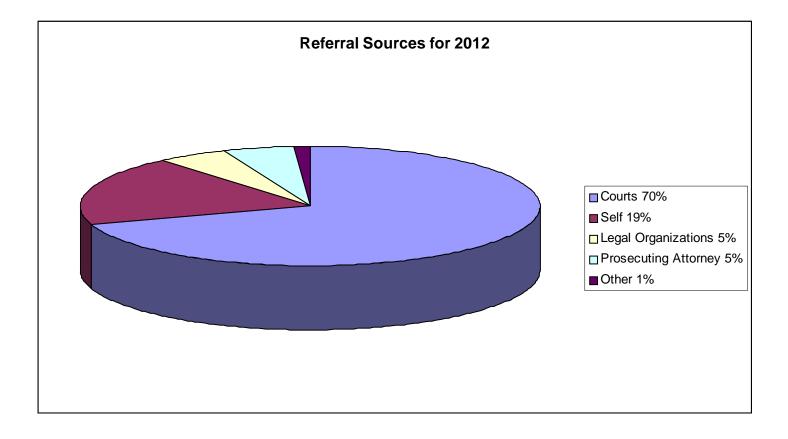

Fund Raising and Grants

The eighth annual Theatre Party was held on Monday, March 12. NCM budgeted \$9,000.00 in revenue and \$2,577.50 in expenses for a profit of \$6,422.50. In reality, \$9,107.60 was collected in revenue, and expenses totaled \$3,452.02 for a profit of \$5,655.58, which was \$766.92 below budget. Having a lower profit than had been projected was directly attributable to fewer sponsorships and ticket sales, coupled with expenses being higher than had been anticipated.

Although NCM does not charge for mediation services that are ordered by the courts, it does charge a minimal administrative fee for those cases that are not referred by the courts. In 2012, \$3,085.00 was collected in fees. Of the 92 individuals who were charged a fee, 23 of those whose cases are closed did not pay, which represents 25%. This compares to a rate of 22.9% in 2011. An additional \$2,200.00 was collected for Special Education mediation services plus \$2,400.00 for Access & Visitation cases.

Donations for 2012 totaled \$4,250.28, as compared to \$3,210.50 in 2011. The Donor Campaign brought in an additional \$3,775.00, as compared to \$3,050.00 in 2011.

NCM received the following grant awards in 2012:

- The Petoskey Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation
 - \$1,000 for the School Attendance Mediation program
 - \$600 for 12 stackable, upholstered chairs
 - \$460 for portable, air conditioner unit

 - \$2,500 for the Victim-Offender Reconciliation Program, \$2,816.25 to be paid in 2012 and \$625 in 2013
- Rotary Club of Petoskey
 - \$527 for the design and printing of a School Attendance Mediation Program brochure

Board Retreat

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On Thursday, February 9, 2012, the Board of Directors met at the Weathervane Restaurant in Charlevoix for a board retreat. The purpose of the retreat was to provide an educational piece about the court system, including district, circuit and probate courts, through a panel discussion. Serving on the panel were The Honorable Richard Pajtas (33rd Circuit Court), The Honorable Richard May (90th District Court), and The Honorable Frederick Mulhauser (7th Probate Court). This was followed by an explanation of funding along with a discussion of increasing fees.

In Kind Contributions

To a non-profit organization, in-kind contributions are significant for two primary reasons. First, when writing grant applications, in kind donations are considered a means

of determining community support of the organization. Second, in kind donations help to defray expenses. The top five areas of contributions in 2012 related to the following:

The total amount of in kind contributions for 2012 was \$184,703.20, which is slightly below that of 2011, which totaled \$200,792.66. This directly relates to the fact that case filings were lower in 2012 than in 2011; hence, there were fewer cased mediated, which meant that there were fewer mediator hours of volunteerism. The in kind donations for 2012 constituted 53% of the total budget. The total in kind contributions attributable to the mediators themselves represented 84% of the in kind contributions.

Taylor School

Beginning in September 2012, students from Taylor School have been coming over to NCM to clean. They are a wonderful group of special needs students, and they do a very thorough job. They vacuum, dust, seep the floors and make the bathrooms sparkle. Tami Arms, who is their teacher, is exemplary.

Certificate of Appreciation

During the Executive Director's year as District Governor of Rotary International, the Board of Directors and the staff of NCM were very supportive of her endeavors. Whether or not she was in the office or on the road, she knew that all work would get done and get done well. For this reason, she invited the Executive Committee of the Board and the staff to be her guests at a Rotary Club of Petoskey weekly meeting in September. At that time, she presented NCM with a Certificate of Appreciation. This recognition is a means of honoring an organization through a \$1,000 donation to The Rotary Foundation. This money is then used to support humanitarian, educational and medical projects around the world.

Financial Analysis

Although NCM entered the year 2012 with concerns relating to the financial picture, it ended the year with a gain of \$3,712.13. Due to the fact that there could have been a gain of \$5,712.13, the Executive Director purchased postage in the amount of \$2,000.00 to be included in the 2012 expenses but which will actually be used in 2013. This action was also taken to help ease the loss that is being anticipated for the 2013 fiscal year. This loss is projected due to three factors:

- A decrease in funding from SCAO in the amount of \$5,105.52
- A decrease in local funding by \$3,000.00
- A decrease in Access & Visitation funding from the federal government by \$600.00

The total amount of reduced funding totals \$8,705.52.

Summary

The year 2012 turned out to be a good one for NCM.. The year 2013, however, will create significant challenges as a result of significant funding cuts. To offset the decreases in funding, NCM will have to find additional ways of creating revenue while at the same time making significant cuts in its expenses.
