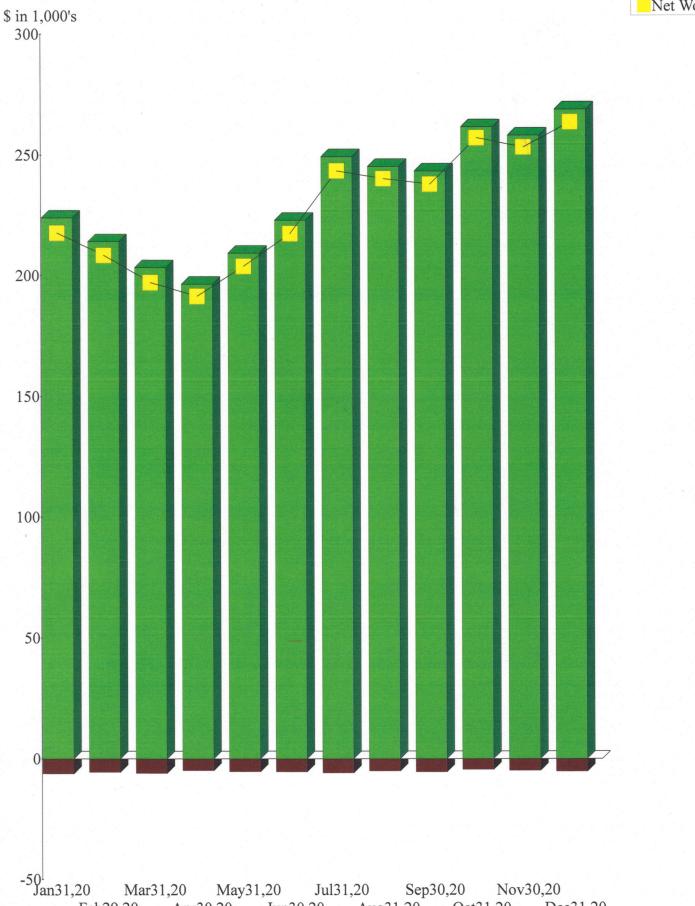
Income and Expense by Month January through December 2020

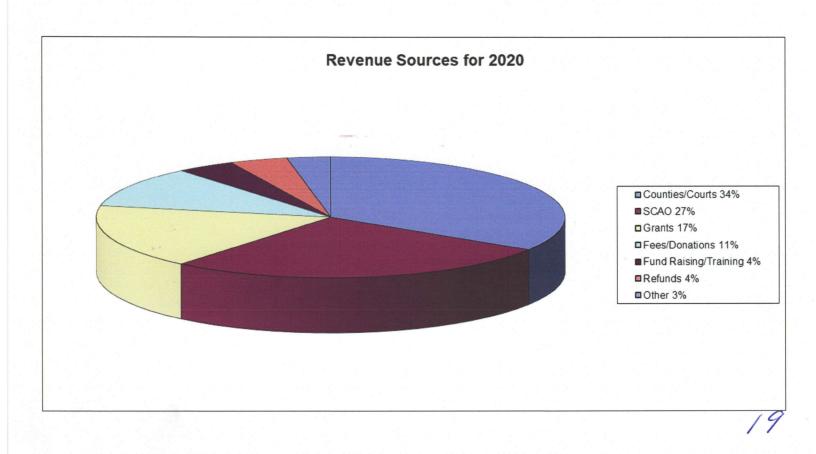

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2019

Personnel

The year 2020 started out like any other until the month of March. It was at this time that Northern Community Mediation (NCM) began to realize the harsh realities of the pandemic. NCM was in the forefront of offering mediations via Zoom rather than inperson. This required a quick learning curve on the part of staff. Their adaptation to the changes in how business was conducted was more than admirable, especially since most work has had to be done remotely with limited time actually in the office.

The volunteer mediators also rose to the occasion. Although staff has to set-up the Zoom mediations and handle the document signing, they are able to conduct other work while mediations are occurring because the mediators have been willing to learn how to do Zoom. If they had not done so, NCM would not have been able to sustain offering mediation services.

NCM presently has 51 mediators. The majority of the volunteer mediators have received advanced training in specialized fields of mediation, which include the following:

- Child Protection
- Divorce/Domestic Relations
- Advanced General Civil
- Guardianship
- Parenting Time
- Special Education
- Victim-Offender Reconciliation
- Mental Health
- School Attendance
- Safety & Security

COVID-19 also had an impact on the Restorative Practices (RP) Program at Boyne City High School because for several months in the spring, school was not in session. The impact of the virus continued into the 2020-2021 school year. With a million dollar cut in funding for the Boyne City School District, the RP Coordinator's position was eliminated. This had a significant effect upon the caseload for 2020, and will continue to do so throughout 2021.

NCM enforces the State Court Administrative Office (SCAO) requirement that mediators complete a minimum of eight hours of continuing education every two years. NCM also continues to be in compliance with the State Court Administrative Office (SCAO) policy for background checks. All employees, interns, volunteer mediators and other volunteers must undergo a background check through the Michigan State Police (ICHAT), as well as a criminal registry check through the Department of Human Services every two years.

Trainings and Workshops

Northern Community Mediation (NCM) had originally scheduled an eight-hour, advanced mediator training in May. The training was to have been divided into four segments:

- Working with People with Personality Disorders
- Restorative Practices
- The Mediator's Health & Well Being
- Power Imbalance at the Mediation Table

Because of COVID-19, the training was postponed until September 11. Unfortunately, it was still not advisable to have gatherings of people. Therefore, the eight-hours of training were re-formatted into two segments—Restorative Practices and Personality Disorders—to accommodate offering the training via Zoom. Two-and-a-half of the eight hours were done asynchronously prior to September 11. Twenty-eight people participated in the training.

On January 16, 2020 NCM conducted its annual meeting for 2019. It was held at City Park Grill in Petoskey, Michigan. Minutes of that meeting will be available on the NCM website (www.northernmediation.org) upon approval by the Board of Directors at the 2021 Annual Meeting, which is scheduled for Thursday, January 21, 2021.

The Board of Directors met in-person two times in 2020: January and March. The January board meeting followed the annual meeting on January 16. The May, July, September and November board meetings were conducted over Zoom. The minutes of the Board of Directors meetings are available on the NCM website. The Executive Committee met in-person in February. The April, June, August and October Executive Committee meetings were held via Zoom.

The board held its annual Board Retreat at Stiggs Brewery & Kitchen in Boyne City from 4:30pm to 8:00pm on Monday, February 17. Following the introduction of new Board member Emily Hoffman, Jane Millar shared information about the Petoskey Theatre Party, the 2020 calendar and the statewide evaluation report. President Bob Banner then reviewed the mission and vision statements with the Board. Each Board member then completed a self-evaluation, which was followed by discussions relating to Governance Policies, By-Laws, Board involvement in fund raising, financials and community focus groups.

On Thursday, May 28, NCM held its annual, Appreciation Gala via Zoom. Doug Van Epps, Executive Director of the Office of Dispute Resolution (ODR) under the State Court Administrative Office (SCAO) was the guest speaker. He lauded NCM, specifically noting the contribution that is made by all of the mediators. The following individuals were recognized for their contributions to NCM:

- Veteran Mediator of the Year Denise Drake
- Rookie Mediator of the Year Steve Hall
- Advocate of the Year Cyndy Tonkavich

In addition to regular meetings relating to the operations of NCM, such as weekly staff meetings and a yearly staff retreat, the staff has traditionally participated in a variety of meetings and gatherings. As a result of COVID-19, most events were cancelled, such as the Chamber Expos. Meeting with school personnel and the like was also curtailed, which resulted in not having the opportunity to deliver the bullying workbooks to all of the elementary schools. This will have to be completed once COVID-19 is no longer the threat that it presently is.

On Tuesday, December 8, 2020 from 5:00 pm to 6:00 pm, NCM held its annual holiday party via Zoom. Fun was had by all. As people entered, stories of holiday memories were shared. This was followed by two games. One was a Trivia game of 20 questions, and the other was a Naughty or Nice game. The evening ended with a piano medley of Charlie Brown Christmas songs by Howard Richards. Approximately 25 people attended.

State-Wide Involvement

The Executive Director continues to be active in the Michigan Community Mediation Association (MCMA). Both meetings of the Citizen Dispute Resolution Program (CDRP) directors were held via Zoom. She maintains contact with Representatives Triston Cole and Lee Chatfield, as well as Senator Wayne Schmidt.

With monthly meetings, Millar continues to be a driving force behind the MCMA. She serves as an advisor to the organization and as a consultant to and liaison between the Association and the SCAO. She continues to take an active role in lobbying for funding for the CDRP. She serves on the MCMA Development Committee, which was responsible for hiring an Executive Liaison for the organization. Gabrielle (Gabi) Rehainian is responsible for lobbying, marketing and grant writing for the MCMA.

On Friday, October 16 and Saturday, October 17, the Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) Section of the State Bar Association (SBA) held its annual conference via Zoom. Executive Director Jane Millar was one of the presenters on Saturday. The topic was "Bullying at the Mediation Table."

Staff Retreat

On Friday, November 13, Northern Community Mediation (NCM) held its annual staff retreat via Zoom. Case Managers Karen Cole and Laura Buckingham along with Executive Director Jane Millar spent a short time reviewing the accomplishments and challenges of 2020. They then focused on plans and strategies for the upcoming year.

Presentations and Promotion

As stated earlier, face-to-face interactions were for all practical purposes non-existent. There were a few Zoom presentations and numerous phone conversations promoting NCM. The Executive Director sent letters of introduction to all newly elected state and local officials.

MI-Resolve

MI-Resolve, an initiative of the SCAO, is an online service that provides a free, quick and easy way to resolve disputes with the help of a neutral mediator. Just as in a face-to-face mediation, the mediator helps parties find a solution to a dispute that works best for everyone. The only difference is that the mediation is done online by using a platform similar to e-mails. In that MI-Resolve is a secure system, all communication is confidential. If an agreement is reached, appropriate paper work is drawn up, and that agreement is considered to be a contract, enforceable by law.

As a means of helping the CDRP centers implement the program, the SCAO contributed \$10,865.00 to each center.

Caseload

The number of cases opened in 2020 as compared with 2019 was down by 191 cases: 664 vs. 855. The number of cases closed in 2020 as compared to 2019 was down by 176 cases: 667 vs. 843. This drop directly relates to the pandemic. All 17 CDRP centers in the state have experienced the same drop in caseload.

Accounting for 43% of the cases, school related mediations were the most prevalent types of cases in 2020. This was followed by Breach of Contract cases at 27%. Divorce accounted for 10% of the cases and Parenting Time at 8%.

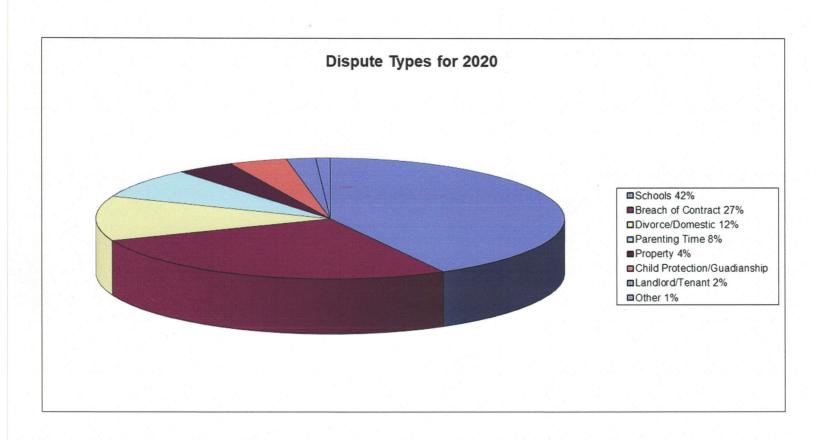

Agreement Rates

When conciliated cases are added together with cases mediated to agreement, there is no significant difference between the agreement rates of 2020 versus 2019. Considering the fact that one-fourth of the way through 2020 all mediations were conducted via Zoom, it is remarkable that the apprehension of Zoom and the reluctance to mediate via Zoom was not greater than it was.

It is worth noting that there were distinct advantages to mediating via Zoom. Everyone came to the table with a common enemy: COVID-19. Secondly, everyone came to the table struggling with the use of technology. Consequently, if one of the parties was having a problem, everyone else rose to the occasion to help. Third, each party could see himself/herself. If he/she had a stern, unpleasant face, that quickly changed.

The agreement rate percentages for 2020 are depicted in the pie chart entitled Agreement Rates. The table below shows the comparison of agreement rates between 2020 and 2019.

Referral Sources

The number of court referred / ordered cases dropped from 462 in 2019 to 319 in 2020. This is due primarily to the fact that court filings in general dropped as a result of COVID-19. It is anticipated that this trend will continue well into 2021.

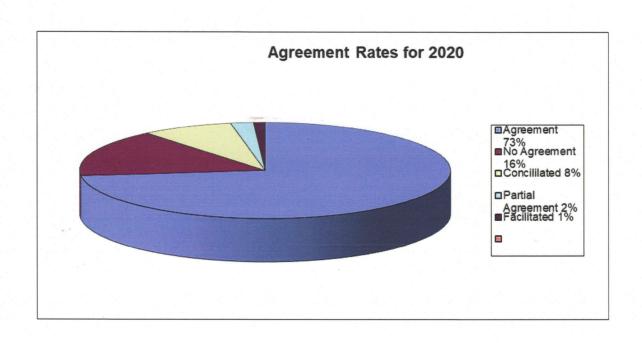
If it were not for COVID-19, there would undoubtedly have been significantly more school-related cases. With schools' not being in session for a good portion of the spring of 2020, both the Restorative Practices (RP) Program at Boyne City High School and the School Attendance Mediation Program were negatively impacted. Although the School Attendance Mediation Program will undoubtedly be quite active during the 2020-2021 school year, quite the contrary is true of the RP Program because of significant funding cuts in the Boyne City Public Schools' budget.

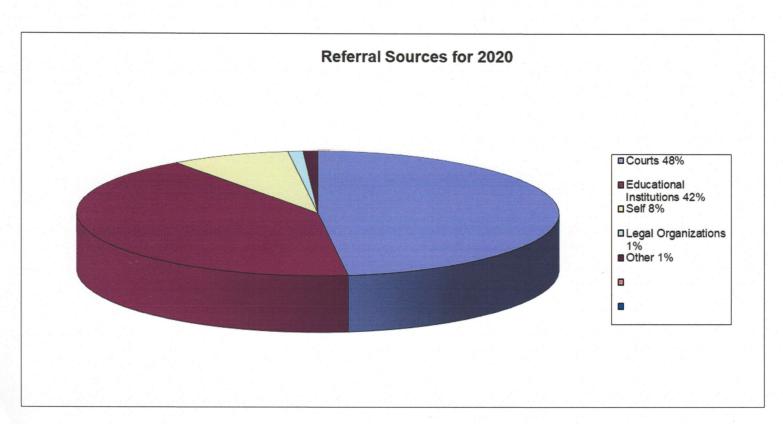

Fund Raising

The sixteenth annual, Petoskey Theatre Party was held on Monday, March 9. NCM budgeted \$11,000 in revenue and \$2,395.00 in expenses for a profit of \$8,605.00. In reality, \$10,000.25 was collected in revenue, and expenses totaled 2,716.69 for a profit of \$7,283.56, which was \$1,321.44 under budget. By being more aggressive in obtaining sponsorships and selling tickets, NCM could reverse this trend. It should be noted that one week after the Petoskey Theatre Party, Michigan found itself in a lockdown situation because of COVID-19.

Fees

NCM does charge a minimal administrative fee for most cases. Those cases for which there is no charge are school attendance, access and visitation, victim-offender, special education, and small claims. Additionally, fees are either reduced or waived if it would be a hardship for an individual to pay the fee. If a client is an American Veteran, fees are waived for all parties involved in the case. In 2020, NCM collected \$11,578.55 in general fees as compared to \$11,765.19 in 2019. The fact that although the caseload in 2020 was down from that in 2019 and yet the collection of fees had a difference of only \$186.64 is a testament to the hard work of the case managers.

Both Access & Visitation (ACVS) fees, which come from federal funds, and Special Education fees, which come from Special Education Mediation Services (SEMS) were down in 2020 from 2019. In both circumstances, the caseload was down in these categories, which has a direct correlation to fees for service.

The difference in revenue of \$11,578.55 in the first table above and the \$12,879.95 in the third table above is due to when entries are made into NCM's database called MADTrac and when deposits are made into the checking account.

Financial Impact of Agreements

Although many of the cases mediated by NCM do not involve any sort of financial restitution or settlement, financial issues and commitments are either central or secondary in certain types of cases, such as divorce or breach of contract. In 2020, NCM mediated \$2,772,428.94 worth of settlements.

Donations

NCM had the most successful donor campaign in its history. In addition to the \$12,755.00 that was contributed to the donor campaign in 2020, as of this report, an additional \$975.00 has been received in January 2021, which brings the total for the donor campaign to \$13,730.

Grants

The PPP funding of \$33,000 plus \$14,650.00 from local grants totaled \$47,650.00 in 2020. The breakdown is as follows:

In Kind Contributions

To a non-profit organization, in-kind contributions are significant for two primary reasons. First, when writing grant applications, in kind donations are considered a means of determining community support of the organization. Second, in kind donations help to defray expenses. The top four areas of contributions in 2020 related to the following:

The total amount of in kind contributions for 2020 was \$127,079.08, which is below that of 2019, which totaled \$213,628.92. The in kind donations for 2020 constituted 45% of the total budget. The total in kind contributions attributable to the mediators themselves represented 84% of the in kind contributions.

The significant drop for in-kind contributions from 2019 to 2020 of \$86,549.84 is directly related to the pandemic. For example, mediations as a whole were down, which meant that there were fewer volunteer, mediator hours. Since mediations were being done via Zoom, there was minimal mileage reimbursement, which meant that there was less in-kind for travel. In-kind rent was lower because the City of Charlevoix does not allow non-employees into city hall; therefore, NCM has not been paying rent for its office in city hall.

Financial Analysis

There is no question about it, NCM's finances during 2020 were negatively impacted by COVID-19. As a result of the PPP, the local foundations and MI-Resolve, NCM was able to use those funds to cover 2020 expenses so that it could use its own funds that had been allocated for 2020 to carry over into 2021. Throughout 2020, the biggest concern was not getting through 2020, but rather the longer term impact the pandemic could have on 2021, 2022 and perhaps into 2023 or 2024. Therefore, it is essential that NCM consistently and regularly run financial analyses to ensure NCM's financial stability.

The table titled "Income Projections for 2021-2022 is one such document. Without having to go into reserve, NCM should be able to complete the year 2022 with a slight gain. Hopefully, by the end of 2022, there will be greater stability in the economy. Yet, it is essential that throughout 2021 and 2022 NCM continues to run these types of spread sheets.

Summary

The year 2020 was one of the most challenging years NCM has ever faced. Yet, there were many positives.

- The staff adapted to a new way of doing business. They had to learn Zoom, DocuSign, GoToMyPC and how to work remotely.
- The mediators had to adapt as well. Doing mediations via Zoom brought about challenges that they quickly overcame.
- The Board did not flinch in its responsibilities. In fact, the members of the Board more than rose to the occasion.

- NCM shined above the other 16 CDRP centers in the state, which is why it received the greatest amount of the SCAO, pooled funding.
- The future will find NCM capitalizing upon the use of Zoom. No longer will parties from downstate or out of state have to travel to northern Michigan for a mediation. Zoom will be the alternative.
- Zoom will also be used for the staff retreat because of the convenience of screen sharing.
- The use of electronic communication will be emphasized, which will save in printing and postage expenses.
- Assuming that the citizens of Charlevoix and Emmet counties eventually make use of MI-Resolve, a more efficient means of resolving conflict will be realized.
