

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2019

Personnel

Case Manager Karen Cole and Executive Director Dr. Jane Millar were employed by Northern Community Mediation (NCM) for the full year. Case Manager Caroline Smith resigned from her position so that she could attend law school. Caroline was replaced by Case Manager Laura Buckingham.

Restorative Practices Coordinator at Boyne City High School retired at the end of the school year. He was replaced by Myra Bryant.

In addition to the paid staff, NCM has 52 volunteer mediators. An additional two mediators will be added to the list once their observation hours have been met, which will be in February 2020. The majority of the volunteer mediators have received advanced training in specialized fields of mediation, which include the following:

- Child Protection
- Divorce/Domestic Relations
- Advanced General Civil
- Guardianship
- Parenting Time
- Special Education
- Victim-Offender Reconciliation
- Mental Health
- School Attendance
- Safety & Security

NCM enforces the State Court Administrative Office (SCAO) requirement that mediators complete a minimum of eight hours of continuing education every two years. NCM also continues to be in compliance with the State Court Administrative Office (SCAO) policy for background checks. All employees, interns, volunteer mediators and other volunteers must undergo a background check through the Michigan State Police (ICHAT), as well as a criminal registry check through the Department of Human Services every two years.

Trainings and Workshops

During the last week in May and the first week in June, NCM offered the Forty-Hour, General Civil Mediation Training. There were 26 participants. The table below depicts

Local Meetings & Gatherings

On January 17, 2019 NCM conducted its annual meeting for 2018. It was held from 12:01 pm to 12:38 pm at City Park in Petoskey, Michigan. Minutes of that meeting will be available on the NCM website (www.northernmediation.org) upon approval of the Board of Directors at the 2020 Annual Meeting, which is scheduled for Thursday, January 16, 2020.

The Board of Directors met in person six times in 2019: January, March, May, July, September and November. The January board meeting followed the annual meeting on January 17. The minutes of the Board of Directors meetings are available on the NCM website. The Executive Committee met in February, April, June, August and October.

The board held its annual Board Retreat at the Boyne City Tap Room from 4:30pm to 8:00pm on Tuesday, March 19. Following opening remarks by Jane Millar and a review of NCM's mission and vision statements by Bob Banner, committee reports were given: Stuart Fenton for the Local Government Focus Group, Bob Banner for the State Government Focus Group and Kirstyn Horan for the Local Community Focus Group. While eating dinner, Millar reviewed the 2019 calendar and then led discussions about the assets and liabilities of the organization and how to overcome these shortcomings. Bob Banner then worked with the group to determine a timeline and who would be responsible for overseeing the various challenges.

On Tuesday, May 21, the Appreciation Gala was held in the Resort Room of Stafford's Perry Hotel. Approximately 40 attended the event. The following individuals were recognized for the contributions to NCM:

In addition to regular meetings relating to the operations of NCM, such as weekly staff meetings and a yearly staff retreat, the staff participates in a variety of meetings. In all, staff members participate in several hundred meetings/gatherings throughout the year. These include but are not limited to monthly Human Services Coordinating Body meetings, Great Start Collaborative meetings, executive director brown bag lunches, monthly Connecting Women in Business luncheons, annual meetings of the five Chambers of Commerce, the two local community foundations & the Northern Lakes Economic Alliance, State of the Community and gala events in Boyne City, Charlevoix, East Jordan, Harbor Springs and Petoskey, Breakfast for Champions, and the Tribute Awards It is believed that participation in community is essential to the growth and awareness of NCM and its services.

The Executive Director met with the staffs of 10 elementary schools in the Charlevoix-Emmet Intermediate School District service area for the purpose of delivering and explaining the Bullying Activity Books, which were funded by four local Kiwanis clubs. In July, she also met with the Boyne City Board of Education.

Regular meetings with court personnel and the 90th District, 33rd Circuit, 57th Circuit and 7th Probate judges are essential to maintaining positive, working relationships among all

parties involved. This commitment extends to all of the social service agencies in Charlevoix and Emmet counties, such as the Department of Health & Human Services.

On Tuesday, December 10, 2019 from 4:30 pm to 6:00 pm, NCM held its annual holiday party. Everyone in attendance enjoyed food, beverage, conversation and friendship. Approximately 30 people attended.

State-Wide Involvement

The Executive Director continues to be active in the Michigan Community Mediation Association. She also attended two meetings in Lansing along with the 17 other CDRP executive directors around the state. She maintains contact with Representatives Triston Cole and Lee Chatfield, as well as Senator Wayne Schmidt.

With monthly meetings, Millar continues to be a driving force behind the Michigan Community Mediation Association. She serves as an advisor to the organization and as a consultant to and liaison between the Association and the SCAO. At the state level, she also attended meetings in Lansing for the CDRP directors, participated in the Nonprofit Legislative Day in Lansing, and has taken on an active role in lobbying for funding for the CDRP. This has given her the opportunity to meet several times with Representatives Triston Cole and Lee Chatfield, as well as Senator Wayne Schmidt.

Executive Director Jane Millar attended the annual Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) Section of the State Bar Association (SBA) conference in Plymouth that ran from Friday, October 11 through Saturday, October 12. Also in October she also attended the Peace in the Streets Conference that was held in Detroit, Michigan and Windsor, Ontario. She also participated in a statewide meeting for the coordination of Special Education mediation.

Staff Retreat

On Friday, November 22, Northern Community Mediation (NCM) held its annual staff retreat in the board room of the Perry Hotel. Case Managers Karen Cole and Laura Buckingham along with Executive Director Jane Millar spent a short time reviewing the accomplishments and challenges of 2019. They then focused on plans and strategies for the upcoming year.

Presentations and Promotion

The year 2019 was a busy one in terms of participation in community events. NCM participated in Project Connect, a day of free services for those in need provided by various non-profit organizations in the community. NCM also participated in the Information Summit, which is sponsored by the Human Services Coordinating Body, provides an opportunity for those individuals involved with social service agencies to network and learn more about one another's services.

The Executive Director served as a mentor for Leadership Little Traverse, a program sponsored by the Petoskey Chamber of Commerce, as well as a mentor for Leadership Charlevoix County, a program sponsored by the Charlevoix Chamber of Commerce. She was a presenter for both of these organizations, as well as for Leadership Charlevoix County Alumni. In October, she was the keynote speaker at Connecting Women in Business, an event which drew more people than ever before.

NCM also maintained a presence at the Chamber of Commerce Expos in Boyne City, Charlevoix and Petoskey, and facilitated at the Petoskey Middle School for Career Day. Presence of NCM was also apparent at the YMCA Anniversary Party, the Women's Resource Center Women Can/Women Do in both Charlevoix and Petoskey, and the Family Engagement Night at Concord Academy Petoskey.

Caseload

The number of cases opened in 2019 as compared with 2018 was up by 27 cases: 855 vs. 828. The number of cases closed in 2019 as compared to 2018 was down by 4 cases: 843 vs. 847. Neither of these differences is of significance.

Breach of Contract continues to be the most prevalent type of case (41%). This is followed by cases involving the Restorative Practices and School Attendance Mediation Programs (35%).



Agreement Rates

Agreement rates for 2019 were significantly higher than in 2018. This may be attributable to the fact that in 2019 there were more school related mediations, which tend to have a higher agreement rate, and fewer breach of contract cases, which tend to have a lower agreement rate, than in 2018.

The agreement rate percentages for 2018 are depicted in the pie chart entitled Agreement Rates. The table below shows the comparison of agreement rates between 2019 and 2018.

Referral Sources

The number of court referred / ordered cases dropped from 591 in 2018 to 482 in 2019. This is due primarily to the fact that court filings in general dropped. During the first six months in 2019, there were 84 fewer court filings in Emmet County alone than in 2018. This pattern continued through the end of the year. Charlevoix County experienced the same decline in court filings.


The significant increase in referrals from educational institutions directly relates to Myra Bryant's enhanced approach to the Restorative Practices Mediation Program at Boyne City High School. In 2018, there were 94 Restorative Practices mediations, whereas in 2019, there were 224.



Fund Raising

The fifteenth annual, Petoskey Theatre Party was held on Monday, March 11. NCM budgeted \$11,700.00 in revenue and \$2,475.00 in expenses for a profit of \$9,225.00. In reality, \$11,344.00 was collected in revenue, and expenses totaled 2,988.74 for a profit of \$8,355.26, which was \$869.74 under budget. By being more aggressive in obtaining sponsorships and selling tickets, NCM could reverse this trend.

On October 14, NCM held its fourth annual Theatre Party in Charlevoix. Prior to going to the Charlevoix Cinema, guests enjoyed food and beverages at The Weathervane Restaurant. NCM budgeted \$5,500.00 in revenue and \$2,020.00 in expenses for a profit of \$3,480.00. With \$4,953.00 in revenue and \$1,712.95 in expenses, NCM realized a profit of \$3,240.05. Although the profit from the fund raiser was \$239.95 below budget, NCM will again host a theatre party in Charlevoix in 2020. As in the case of the Petoskey Theatre Party, NCM will be more aggressive in 2020 in obtaining sponsorships and selling tickets than it was in 2019.

Fees

NCM does charge a minimal administrative fee for most cases. Those cases for which there is no charge are school attendance, access and visitation, victim-offender, special education, and small claims. Additionally, fees are either reduced or waived if it would be a hardship for an individual to pay the fee. If a client is an American Veteran, fees are waived for all parties involved in the case. In 2019, NCM collected \$11,765.19 in fees from 179 individuals as compared to \$8,510.00 from 118 participants in 2018. In 2019, \$1,300.00 in fees was written off as uncollectable, as compared to \$1,900.00 in 2018. The fact that the caseload from 2018 to 2019 differed by only four cases and that 61 more individuals paid their fees in 2019 than in 2018 indicates that NCM staff has improved in its collection rate, which can be attributed to three factors: 1) Fees are now considered to be Administrative Fees and the clients are being charged whether or not mediation takes

place; 2) PayPal payments are now accepted; and 3) The case Managers are being somewhat more firm in explaining the fee structure.

In 2019, NCM received \$3,900.00 from the federal government for access and visitation cases, as compared to \$4,375.00 in 2018. In both cases, the amount received was the maximum amount that could have been received. For special education cases, NCM was awarded from the Department of Special Education \$6,650.00 in 2018 and \$7,750.00 in 2018. The decrease in funding from the Department of Special Education relates to the fact that the Executive Director was not able to schedule as many presentations relating to the Special Education Mediation Program.as would have been desirable

There was a potential for an additional \$5,725.00 in fees. These fees were either waived or cancelled. Fees are cancelled when a case is unamenable for mediation or NCM is unable to contact the party(ies). Fees are waived or partially waived when in the opinion of the Case Managers it would be a hardship for the party(ies) to pay the fee.

Financial Impact of Agreements

Although many of the cases mediated by NCM do not involve any sort of financial restitution or settlement, financial issues and commitments are either central or secondary in certain types of cases, such as divorce or breach of contract. In 2019, NCM mediated \$4,124,051.92 worth of settlements.

Donations

Donations for 2019 totaled \$6,813.15, as compared to \$9,820.00 in 2018. Although the total amount in donations is only \$186.85 less than was budgeted for the year, it is \$3,006.85 less than was collected in 2018. The 314 donor campaign letters that were sent out generated responses from 31 individuals for a return rate of .09%. Strategies for increasing donations will be discussed at the 2020 board retreat.

Board Retreat

On Wednesday, March 14, 2019, the Board of Directors met at the Tap Room in Boyne City for its annual board retreat. Executive Director Jane Millar introduced new board member Maureen Hollocker and explained the program cost analysis report, as well as the online mediation project that is being piloted in three of the Citizen Dispute Resolution Program (CDRP) centers.

President Bob Banner then reviewed the mission and vision statements. Stuart Fenton, Bob Banner and Kirstyn Horan then gave progress reports consecutively on the three board committees, Local Government Focus, State Government Focus and Local Community Focus.

The Board then listed NCM's assets, as well as its liabilities. Then the Board determined the most important strengths of the organization, followed by identifying the greatest challenges that face NCM. During the year, the committees will each work towards utilizing the assets and overcoming the liabilities.

In Kind Contributions

To a non-profit organization, in-kind contributions are significant for two primary reasons. First, when writing grant applications, in kind donations are considered a means of determining community support of the organization. Second, in kind donations help to defray expenses. The top four areas of contributions in 2019 related to the following:

The total amount of in kind contributions for 2019 was \$213,628.92, which is above that of 2018, which totaled \$166,526.62. The in kind donations for 2019 constituted 46% of the total budget. The total in kind contributions attributable to the mediators themselves represented 80% of the in kind contributions.

Financial Analysis

The year 2019 was another relatively strong year for NCM. In evaluating the year-end financial statements, it is important to note that the Total Income on the income page of \$245,043.23 is compared to the Total Expenses on the expense page of \$240,097.87. This represents the cash flow for general operating expenses, which excludes unrealized gains and depreciation. Therefore, based upon cash flow, NCM ended the year 2019 in the black by \$4,945.36

The balance sheet, previous year comparison shows a gain of \$4,890.73 (\$195,464.34 - \$190,573.61), which is a 2.6% gain.

Summary

The year 2019 was another outstanding year for NCM.

- As the end of the year approached, it appeared that NCM would barely end the year in the black. As it turns out, NCM ended the year in the black by \$4,945.36
- Although Case Manager Caroline Smith resigned so that she could go to law school, Case Manager Laura Buckingham was hired to replace her and has contributed towards a smooth transition.
- The Board has been highly active, particularly the Local Community Awareness Committee.
- All Board members have agreed to continue their tenure.
- Emily Hoffman will be joining the Board in 2020.
- NCM continues to be one of the top performing CDRP centers in the state.
