# **FACE-TO-FACE MEDIATIONS**

When will we return to scheduling face-to-face mediations? The answer to that question is being answered in a recently submitted press release.

"In determining when NCM will return to offering face-toface encounters, several factors enter into that decision: 1) expertise of medical professionals; 2) mandates from Lansing; 3) guidelines from the State Court Administrative Office and the Office of Dispute Resolution in Lansing; 4) feedback from the courts; 5) input from other local organizations; 6) advice form community leaders; 7) last but certainly not least, the safety, health and well-being of the NCM staff and volunteer mediators."

It is unlikely that consideration will be given to scheduling face-to-face mediations prior to the middle of June. When and if that happens, we may impose certain requirements. Due to the fact that Brother Dan's uses the downstairs on Mondays and Tuesdays, mediations will be scheduled only on Thursdays and Fridays. Additionally, we may require that temperatures of all participants have to be taken as they enter, and if someone has a temperature, the mediation will be cancelled, and we may require that everyone wears a face mask, which will be provided by NCM. If these sound draconian, so be it.
